

#### Watch out for coyote!

There is a variety of wild animals in the community, and the steps below can help ensure your safety and that of your pets if you run into one.

We all hope you have a wonderful April and enjoy the spring!

Editor's note: The following information is reprinted with permission from the Community Associations Institute to help residents in homeowners' associations.

#### How to be safe if wild animals appear

- 1. Report sightings of wild animals to California Department of Fish and Wildlife at 1-559-243-4005, extension 133, especially if the animal is not intimidated by loud noise or lights or if you see it during the daytime.
- 2. Don't leave bins on the street or set food out. Secure lids on trash and recycling bins.
- 3. Pick fruit as soon as it's ripe, and pick up and discard fallen fruit daily.
- 4. Avoid bird feeders. The aroma attracts scavengers even though they can't reach the nuts and seeds.
- 5. Don't put meat scraps in compost heaps.
- 6. Don't let cats and dogs outside unattended, especially at night.
- 7. Walk your dog on a short leash, at your side, not behind you, at all times. If you encounter a coyote, pick up the dog and walk away.
- 8. Don't walk near bushy vegetation, particularly at dusk and dawn, and avoid walking near abandoned or neglected properties.
- 9. Carry a flashlight, air horn, or bear or pepper spray when walking. If caught unprepared, shout and throw small objects.

### KERN CITY BOARD MEETINGS

KCCA'S REGULAR BOARD MEETING MINUTES March 12, 2019, 9:00 a.m.

I. CALL TO ORDER: Director Jolene Simons called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. Other directors present: Ray Hallmark, Roger Kirby, Steve Parks (by speaker phone), Kyle Ray, Carol Ann Toms and Donna Tyner and Manager Jill Foley. Director Simons welcomed attendees, and member Fred Hufnagel led the flag salute.

Announcements: President Simons said the Sundale Country Club is still in escrow. Director Ray reported that the club has hired a chef from Las Vegas for its restaurant.

II. MINUTES: Director Tyner. Director Kirby moved to accept the Feb. 12, 2019 board meeting minutes as presented. Vote: Passed, unanimous.

III. TREASURER'S REPORT: Director Tyner reported that as of Feb. 28, the Checking Account had \$336,823.74 and the Reserve Account had a balance of \$456,244. She explained that the board had announced several times last year that it would hold off incurring new expenses, including the Town Hall floor, so that money would be left over from 2018 to bring the Reserve Account up to where it should be according to the annual Reserve Study. That was very successful, and we deposited \$80,000 into Reserves early this month. That Reserve Study says the ideal Reserve Fund Balance for 2019 is \$371,596, so we have not only achieved that goal, there is now enough money to do the Town Hall floor and other items this year.

IV. MANAGER'S REPORT: Jill Foley. Any Klarion classified ads and Letters to the Editor are due March 15. Condolences go to the loved ones of residents C. W. Faucett and Santiago Frayre.

Special Speakers: The 50-Plus group will send two speakers this month on Wednesday, March 27, from 5:30 to 6:30 pm in the Town Hall. The topics are "Downsizing – The overwhelming task of moving" by Cheryl Ketchum, Watson Realty, and "An Introduction to Dynamic Risk Management (aka How Not to Become a Walmart Greeter unless you want to...)" by Brad Barnes, Founder & CEO of Entruity Wealth Driver Class: In April Judy Harris will lead another senior driving class which can help reduce car insurance costs and bring seniors up to date on the latest information. It will be a complete course, not just a refresher, and it will be four hours on two Saturdays. Watch the Klarion for more information. A coyote has been spotted in Kern City at River Oaks and Casper. Please make sure your small pets are safe.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

- a. Architectural: Director Ray reported approvals were given for: Converting a carport to a garage; 4 requests to paint houses; 2 requests to paint trim; install solar; add a flagpole; add a shed; and add a garage.
- b. Compliance: Director Ray said we resolved or were working on the following: Residents allowing dogs to run loose; not picking up after a dog; 2 property maintenance issues; and a house with tarp covers.
- c. RV/Garden: Director Kirby said someone who was up to no good got into the RV Park but was spotted by an RV owner who chased him. He ran across the street and jumped a fence into a backyard, but that property was owned by a sheriff who arrested him
- d. Pool: Director Simons said everything looks good at the pool.
- e. Library: Director Tyner said that she and volunteers were still making improvements to make room for more books, and she appreciated the donations of puzzles and new books they've received lately.
- f. Outside Maintenance: Director Hallmark reported that someone had broken into our storage shed on the north end of the common area but apparently found nothing they wanted to take. He and Director Kirby strengthened the lock on the shed. He also said two people had climbed over a back fence a couple of times lately to enter the pool area and they used the women's restroom to take showers.
- g. Inside Maintenance: Director Toms said these items would be covered under Old and New Business.

VI. OLD BUSINESS -- Action on Replacing Town Hall Floor. Director Toms said that she and directors Simons, Tyner and Ray had received bids from several companies over the last two years to replace the floor in the Town Hall and its restrooms. All the bids were \$25,000 or higher but they had recently received one from Stockdale Tile for \$18,439.42. Director Kirby moved to accept the latest bid and to cap the floor cost at \$19,000. Vote: Passed, unanimous.

#### VII. NEW BUSINESS:

- a. Action on Reserve Study -- Director Simons said that Walla Services had presented a bid to do a complete Reserve Study this year for \$1,650. Other companies' charges are \$7,000 on up but Walla has done ours for years so it gives us a much lower price. Director Ray moved to accept the Walla bid. Vote: Passed, unanimous.
- b. Discussion/Action on Painting Town Hall -- Director Simons said that Director Parks had recommended painting the Town Hall and she appreciated that because we've had many comments over the years about how drab it looks. Repainting is one of the lesser expensive ways to make a place look much better. She noted that Director Ray recommended that a committee choose the paint color, and she

and Directors Toms and Tyner and member Willie Flaherty would like to participate. She asked if any other members were also interested in joining them and member Jan Kennedy offered to help. Director Toms explained that there aren't many times when the Town Hall can be free to be painted and those dates are coming up shortly. She said that when it gets warmer, the painters get booked quickly so she had three companies look at the Town Hall last week to present bids. One company didn't offer a bid, and the other two gave the following: \$7,240 by Sharp's Painting and \$5,500 by the Paint Doctor. She said the committee could choose the color later. She also noted that Asbestos Testing Laboratory tested the Town Hall floor and found no asbestos. Director Ray moved to accept the Paint Doctor's bid but to add the foyer to be painted in addition to the Town Hall. Another \$1,000 to include the foyer was added to the quoted bid. Director Toms will contact the Paint Doctor to arrange a time to get the additional quote for possibly doing the foyer. Vote: Passed, unanimous.

- c. Action on Replacing Bicycle in Exercise Room --Director Toms said the recumbent bicycle in the Exercise Room was damaged and needed to be replaced. Wheeler's Fitness, which gave us the lowest price on our last equipment, offered a new commercial bike for \$2,000 which was discounted from \$2,222.17. Director Ray moved to purchase the bike. Vote: Passed, unanimous.
- d. Action on Additional Fencing -- Emergency vote: Director Ray said that some people were climbing over part of our fencing in the back of the common area by the woodshop and we should add additional fencing to stop that as soon as possible. He moved to check into and purchase additional fencing or fence-top spears to stop that immediately. Vote: Passed, unanimous.

#### VIII. AUDIENCE

a. Public Forum - Fred Hufnagel said the St. Patrick's Dinner will be March 14 and will feature Dave Winstone who performs in Las Vegas, TV and elsewhere. The Pancake Breakfast on March 16 will feature green eggs and ham plus those wonderful pancakes. The next 2nd Friday Potluck will be on April 12. This is a fun and delicious event!

b. Audience -- Member Willie Flaherty said a member of a group called Best Friends is trying to remove some feral cats from one Kern City area and rehome them elsewhere.

IX. ADJOURNMENT: President Simons adjourned the meeting at 9:57 a.m.

er actually followed them to keep them safe and judge their progress. When Jim was crossing the street sweeping his cane back and forth, the tip went between the ankles of a young woman passing by. She tripped and the cane went flying. She crawled on her hands and knees to retrieve the cane and handed it back to him. After the teacher quit laughing, he continued to follow Jim. In spite of the slight mishap, Jim passed with flying colors.

Because some people are trying

to say they're from Social Security and then trying to use the identification information they receive, residents may be sent letters from the real government office asking them to verify their information. If that occurs, check the Social Security website and call the number listed there before providing information.





### **Everyday Life: Living with an Alzheimer's Diagnosis**

An Alzheimer's diagnosis affects the person's family almost as much as the person who is diagnosed. It can be difficult for partners, family members and friends to cope with the changes in the person; many take on caregiving and other responsibilities while at the same time considering a future without their loved ones.

Caregivers should make sure they are receiving the help and support they need.

The Alzheimer's Association lists creating a new balance as one of the biggest challenges for caregivers. You may not know how much help to provide, especially in the early stages of the disease, when the person is still largely independent and are able to work,

drive and go about their daily tasks with relative ease. When you look at when to help and when to back off, consider the following factors:

- Safety: Is there an immediate safety risk for the person with Alzheimer's or others around them? If there is no immediate risk, provide encouragement and supervision, if needed.
- Stress: Prioritize tasks that don't cause unnecessary stress or take steps to make tasks less stressful.
- Assume the best: Assume the person with dementia is able to complete the task.

Don't intervene immediately; watch for signs of frustration before helping. Focus on the person's needs.

• Talk to the person: As long as the person with Alzheimer's is lucid, talk to them about how best to provide support and what tasks are most frustrating or might require some help. Create a plan and a help signal.

You also may reassign house-hold tasks. Budgeting, calendaring, keeping track of medications and organizing are among the most difficult tasks for someone suffering with dementia, so a partner may want to take those on or at least take on a larger or more supervisory role. In addition, people with Alzheimer's may need reminders about appointments and remembering dates such as

birthdays and anniversaries. Find responsibilities that the person is able to do by themselves or without much oversight, helping them to retain as much independence as possible.

This balance will change as the disease progresses, so be open to reassessing the person's needs and having these conversations regularly.

A person in the early stages of Alzheimer's also is likely to feel a sense of loss, grief, rage, denial, frustration and other emotions, similarly to what family members feel

Consider talking to grief counselor or joining a support group.




