DRAFT KCCA'S REGULAR BOARD MEETING MINUTES

December 9, 2025, 9:00 a.m.

The meeting will be videotaped and recorded. The tape recording will be erased after the minutes are done.

I. CALL TO ORDER:

a. Welcome -- President Seymour called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m. Other directors present: Buster Beebe, Kelley Lee, Ilene Schechter, Darryl Slavin, Donna Tyner and Jill Wolf and Manager Jill Foley. President Seymour welcomed attendees, and Sharon Parks led the flag salute.

b. Announcements -- President Seymour welcomed everyone and reminded them to turn off their cell phones and that this was the final board meeting of the year.

II. MINUTES: Director Tyner asked if there were any corrections to the Nov. 11, 2025 Regular and Annual Meetings minutes. There were none so the minutes were accepted as presented.

III. TREASURER'S REPORT: Director Tyner reported that as of Nov. 30, 2025, the Checking Account had \$27,795.81. There is \$77,696.70 of the checking account money in a Money Market Account at Mechanics Bank. Therefore, the total in Mechanics Bank as of Nov. 30, 2025 is \$105,492.51.

At Valley Strong there is \$104,353.66 in the Money Market account. In the Edward Jones account, there is \$230,000 in a CD, \$60,026.40 in a CD and \$137,897.88 in another CD. There is also \$239,778.68 in a Money Market account. The total in Edward Jones is \$667,702.96. Between the three banking institutions there is \$877,549.13. Director Tyner stated next year the interest earned from each account this year will be removed and put into the checking and money market accounts.

IV. MANAGER'S REPORT: Manager Foley reported the deadline to turn in Letters to the Editor or classified ads is Friday, Dec. 12th, by noon for the January *Klarion*. This is a little early due to the holidays. She told residents to call the office if they had not yet received their invoice for the 2026 assessment and the Annual Disclosures, which discuss residents' rights in Kern City. The office has

not heard of anyone passing and appreciates the office being notified when a resident passes away.

V. COMMITTEE REPORTS:

a. Pool -- Director Lee said the pool is 46 degrees, but the pool is open. The Polar Bear Plunge will be held on Jan. 1st.

b. Inside Maintenance -- Director Wolf stated the quarterly maintenance was done on the exercise equipment and new padding for the abdominal machine has been ordered. The gardening committee is still actively cleaning up the landscaping, but the water is turned off until all the leaks have been fixed. Director Wolf thanked residents Daryl Wolf, Wyatt Ross and Tedi Smart for helping her put up the outside Christmas lights.

c. Outside Maintenance -- Director Slavin reported the gutters were repaired yesterday and the trees have been trimmed. The four trees by the waterfall were removed, which should stop leaves from clogging up the gutters.

d. RV Storage -- Director Beebe stated the RV Storage looks good and is weed free. He thanked Daryl Wolf and Joe Newton for all their help.

e. Special Projects -- Director Tyner said the Early Bird Dinner at the Sundale Country Club will be on Dec. 17, which is early this month due to the holidays. It will be held in the Phoenix Dining Room and will be coulotte steak with creamy peppercorn sauce, house-made mashed potatoes, vegetables, garden salad and a roll for \$29.

The Kern City Volunteer Luncheon will be on April 17th next year and more details will be in the *Klarion* next year.

f. Library -- Director Tyner asked residents to go through what they are donating and to please not donate personal items like wedding guest lists or photo albums as an example. She reported that the library is stocked with Christmas cards and there are a lot of new books in the library. Manager Foley stated Kern City is a 501 C 7 non-profit business, which means donated items are not tax deductible.

g. Local Associations -- Director Schechter report-

ed everything is up to date so far and continues to get new information regarding the Local Associations board members and dues as they hold new board meetings.

She asked if anyone sees a house/condo for sale or rent to please let the office know, as the office is trying to keep track of that information.

VI. OLD BUSINESS: None

VII. NEW BUSINESS:

a. Action on Hiring Gutter Cleaner/Resealer -- President Seymour stated the Board would need to approve an emergency project to protect the card room. Recent rains caused the gutters to overflow and flood the card room. President Seymour said a drain is likely to be added to keep the water away from the building. The lowest bid of \$4,919.50 was from Leaf Filter to clean, repair sagging gutters, seal the gutters and add wedges. Director Tyner made a motion to accept the bid from Leaf Filter for \$4,919.50. Vote: Passed, unanimous.

b. Action on Hiring a Plumber for Leak -- President Seymour stated the board would need to approve an emergency project to fix a water pipe leak by the card room. The plumber will need to go under the sidewalk to fix it. Bakersfield Plumbing came in with an estimate of \$5,250 to do the repairs. It has repaired and replaced pipes here for years. Director Wolf made the motion to hire Bakersfield Plumbing to fix the water leak by the card room. Vote: Passed, unanimous.

VIII. Directors Forum: Director Beebe thanked President Seymour for his years on the board and all that he has done for Kern City and presented him with a gift certificate from Kern City. Director Schechter stated she appreciated the support she has received from all the directors and the community. Director Tyner thanked the board for the cooperative way they have worked together this last year. She also thanked the office staff for their support. Director Beebe thanked Director Wolf for her work in making Kern City look so good.

President Seymour thanked all the board members he has worked with in the last four years,

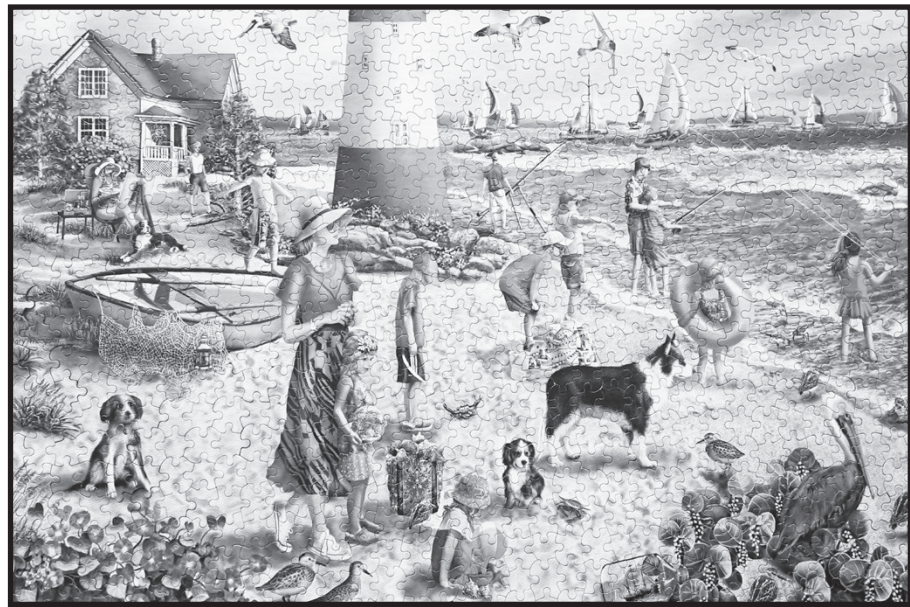

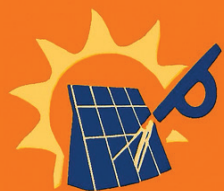

As a pastor for over 50 years, I've seen a multitude of people with all kinds of different emotions displayed. From joy, happiness and feelings of pleasure to deep depression, fears and loneliness. It seems to me that more women than men will share their negative emotions.

Loneliness is a growing problem in our society. A study by the American Council of Life Insurance reported that the loneliest group in America are college students. That's surprising! Next on the list are divorced people, welfare recipients, single mothers, rural students, housewives, and the elderly.
